FASTING AND ABSTINENCE REGULATIONS FOR HOLY WEEK

Fast and Abstinence from Meat and Dairy Products:

Good Friday April 2. This is obligatory for those between the ages of 14 and 59.

Abstinence from Meat:

Holy Saturday April 3. This is obligatory for those between the ages of 14 and 59. Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday of Holy Week are customary but *not* obligatory.

Try to be with us at as many of the services as you are able in order to fully appreciate and experience what Jesus has done for all of us through his sufferings and his triumphant victory over sin and death. Something new this year at our parish is that we will restore the order of our sacred services to how they occur with matins in the morning and vespers in the evening. So, for the first time, we will be able to celebrate as a parish, the Institution of the Holy Eucharist on Holy Thursday by celebrating the Vespers and Divine Liturgy of St. Basil the Great at 7:00 p.m., and we will hear from the Holy Gospels, about our Lord's Last Supper and his betrayal by Judas.

With Good Friday we will celebrate the Matins of the Passion in the morning as we hear of our Lord's Passion and Death on the cross with the reading of the 12 Gospels. Later in the evening, we will gather together to bury the crucified body of our Lord in the tomb, and then begin the wait, with anticipation and hope, for our Lord's glorious victory.


Especially, this year, please try to come and spend some quiet time before the tomb of our Savior. Come pray for your family, your loved ones, your *babas* and *didos* and all of your family members no longer with us. Let us all also come and pray for vocations to the priesthood during this Year of the Priest. Our church will be open from the conclusion of Good Friday Services until midnight and then will be open from 9:00 a.m. until the beginning of the Easter Vigil Liturgy on Saturday evening at 7:00 p.m. Please be aware that the Saturday Liturgy is our first Paschal Liturgy and does fulfill our obligation for attending Liturgy for Easter.

On Sunday, we will have our Glorious Procession of Joy and Resurrection Matins beginning at 8:00 a.m. and followed by the Paschal Divine Liturgy at 9:00 a.m. We will continue to celebrate during Bright Week, and on the Eighth Day of Easter, Thomas Sunday – Ante Pascha, we will gather as one family at the Divine Liturgy at 10:30 a.m. and later that morning share an Easter Meal at our *Sviachene* as we celebrate the Resurrection of Christ as ONE HOLY FAMILY.
