It is good for us to be here



These are the divine wonders we celebrate today; this is the saving revelation given us upon the mountain; this is the festival of Christ that has drawn us here. Let us listen, then, to the sacred voice of God so compellingly calling us from high, from the summit of the mountain, so that with the Lord's chosen disciples we may penetrate the deep meaning of these holy mysteries, so far beyond our capacity to express. Jesus goes before us to show us the way, both up the mountain and into heaven, and – I speak boldly – it is for us now to follow him with all speed, yearning for the heavenly vision that will give us a share in his radiance, renew our spiritual nature and transform us into his own likeness, making us for ever sharers in his Godhead and raising us to heights as yet undreamed of.

TRANSFIGURATION OF CHRIST - Our Transformation

In our church calendar, there is one Great Feast falling toward the end of the Church Year which gives us the image of this reality [our final transformation] and actually celebrates it: August 6, the Transfiguration of Christ. His transfiguration in our nature is a preview of our own. It is as though the Father is repeating the insight given in the account of the Burning Bush. In both cases, He is trying to show what His idea of our relationship with Him should be (the purpose or goal of religion). On this Feast, we bless grapes and fruits as a real, tangible sign of Theosis. Grapes are the result of a long transformation, from the seed to the vine to the grape clusters. But further 'growth' is possible. The grapes can be transformed into wine, and by the power of the Holy Spirit sent from the Father, the wine can be transfigured by Divinity and become the Blood of Christ our God. Thus it transforms us.

Peter, James and John did not know what they were in for when Jesus asked them to come with Him one day. When they arrived at the mountain, Jesus was surrounded by light—His face was dazzling as the sun, His clothes radiant with light. The Father's voice said, "This is my beloved Son." To Jesus' left was Moses (representing God's Law) and to His right was Prophet Elias (representing God's prophets). On the icon are Peter, John, and James located below Jesus. The troparion for this feast emphasizes the light that Jesus brought into the world. We ask the Mother of God to pray for us so that Christ will let His "everlasting light shine also upon us sinners." We too ask to be transfigured by the "Giver of Light," Jesus Christ.
