The fulfillment of the law is Christ himself, who does not so much lead us away from the letter as lift us up to its spirit. For the law's consummation was this, that the very lawgiver accomplished His work and changed letter into spirit, summing everything up in Himself and, though subject to the law, living by grace. He subordinated the law, yet harmoniously united grace with it, not confusing the distinctive characteristics of the one with the other, but effecting the transition in a way most fitting for God. He changed whatever was burdensome, servile and oppressive to what is light and liberating, so that we should be enslaved no longer under the elemental spirits of the world, as the Apostle says, nor held fast as bondservants under the letter of the law.


Justly, then, do we celebrate this mystery since it signifies for us a double grace. We are led toward the truth, and we are led away from

God With Us Catechism Nativity of the Mother of God September 8

St. John of Damascus says that "the day of the Nativity of the Mother of God is a day of universal joy, because through the Mother of God the entire human race was renewed and the sorrow of the foremother Eve turned into joy." "Renew, Adam, rejoice, Eve, rejoice, prophets with the apostles and the righteous, because today the general joy of angels and people has sown from the righteous Joachim and Anna: the Virgin Mary." This is how the Church sings and glorifies: "Honorable is Your Nativity, the Most Holy Virgin is pure, many angels in heaven and the human race on earth glorify, because You became the Mother of the Creator of all, Christ God. The beginning of our salvation begins, here is born into the world She who will wipe the head of the devil and bring salvation to the human race. Saints Joachim and Anna were the parents of the Immaculate Virgin. Joachim came from the family of David, from the family of Judah, and Anna - from the family of Aaron. And now the Lord will bless these descendants of the royal and priestly family, the Pure One, their daughter, was born in Nazareth. Nazareth, in Arabic "en-Nazira" - is called the "flower of Galilee". It lies in Galilee, surrounded by mountains on all sides. The town is drowning in vineyards and olive trees, everywhere is peace, quiet and the peace of God. Here, in the midst of that paradise of Galilee, a heavenly flower bloomed, here the Immaculate, Holy and Blessed Virgin Mary was born. And joy came to the house of the righteous Joachim and Anna, because it was at their old age that the Lord blessed them with a child. And even greater joy came in heaven. God the Father looked at her with joy, because he saw in her the Mother of his only-begotten Son, full of love the Son of God and the Holy Spirit looked at her, at that most famous tabernacle, which was to become the temple and sanctuary of God himself. And the choirs of angels rejoiced, because their Queen was born, because the most perfect, holiest, best creation of God's power had come into the world.
